Chronology

BC - "Before Christ", BCE - "Before the Common Era", AD - "anno Domini" ("the year of the Lord") from the birth of Christ, CE - "Common Era" (also called ACE - "After Common Event")

A.U.C. - Latin for "ab urbe condita". This refers to the year of the founding of Rome, legend holds, by Romulus in 754 BC. Most historians settled on this date after estimating a range between 758 and 728 BC.

Dionysius Exiguus placed Christ's birth in this 754th year after Rome. His birth year, once placed between 8 BC and 4 BC, is currently held to be 6 BC. AD refers to this approximate birth year of Jesus Christ.

Cover background Vatican Coat of Arms

The crossed keys symbolize the keys of Simon Peter.

The keys are gold and silver to represent the power of binding and loosing given to the Church.

The triple crown (the tiara) represents the pope's three functions as "supreme pastor", "supreme teacher" and "supreme priest".

The gold cross surmounting the triple crowns symbolizes the crucifixion of Jesus.

Form - His Beatitude the...
Salutation - Most Reverend Lord of (location) / Patriarch of (location) / His Holiness

The two above forms also apply to the Archbishop of Constantinople, New Rome, and some others.

Addressee - Ecumenical Patriarch Form - His All - Holiness Salutation - All Holiness

Addressee - Archdeacon Form - Most Reverend Salutation - Venerable

Addressee – Archbishop / Bishop Form - Most Reverend Salutation - Your Excellency / Bishop

Addressee - Dean (of a cathedral) Form - Dean/Very Reverend Salutation - Very Reverend

Addressee - Monsignor Form - The Right Reverend Salutation - Monsignor

Addressee - Priest Form - Reverend Salutation - Father
